For his steadfast service to Division 19 in leading the communication team and his production of significant research on assessment and selection of service members in the U.S. Army cyber community.

Dr. Wind has demonstrated selfless service to the Society, as evidenced by his extensive dedication in a couple of key leadership roles. Dr. Wind served as the Chair of the Membership Committee in 2017, and the Chair of the Communications Committee in 2019. Most significantly, Dr. Wind has served as Web Master for the Society for Military Psychology over the past two years. As the Web Master, Dr. Wind designed and created the Division's website that has increased the reach of the Society to the broader population. He has made extraordinary contributions to the Society in this role, expanding the reach of the Society through an Internet presence and the curation of a highly informative and inviting website. He is currently a valued member of the newly formed Assessment and Selection Think Tank, which is focused on promoting the innovation, advocacy, and policy in science and practice related to the selection and assessment of military personnel through advocating the use of reliable and valid selection tools and measures.

Dr. Wind is currently a Senior Research Psychologist with the U.S. Army Research Institute for the Behavioral and Social Science, Selection and Assignment Research Unit. In this role, Dr. Wind leads projects with a focus on selection and assignment within the U.S. Army specifically related to cyber realm positions.

Dr. Wind has received several awards for the impressive and important service. He was presented with the Department of the Army Achievement Medal for Civilian Service related to his work, and was also presented with the Department of the Army Certificate of Achievement.
