Colonel (Retired) Paul T. Bartone, PhD

For his major contributions as the parliamentarian for the Society and as a leader, researcher, and teacher in hardiness for leaders and the field of operational military psychology.

Dr. Bartone has a long history of service to the Society for Military Psychology and the military. Dr. Bartone has served as the Parliamentarian for the Society for over 10 years. During this time, he has provided guidance to 10 different presidents and the EXCOM body. He has offered an interpretation of the bylaws to help guide the Society through complicated issues and challenges faced over the years.

Dr. Bartone has earned many accolades for his accomplishments through Division 19 as they relate to military psychology. Over the years, he has drawn upon his broad knowledge and has been recognized by the Society with the 2016 John C. Flanagan Lifetime Achievement Award for his work in the field of military psychology and the 2012 Julius E. Uhlener Award for his contributions related to military selection and recruitment. He served as the President of the Society and APA Fellow, and continues to serve as Member at Large on the Executive Committee for Division 19.

Dr. Bartone is currently a Visiting Research Fellow at the National Defense University Institute for National Security Studies. Throughout his research and academic career, Dr. Bartone has explored how to teach and apply hardiness and resilience in a military context internationally. This knowledge has been used widely throughout the field to better select and train leaders of the U.S. military. The breadth of the applicability of Dr. Bartone's research findings in all areas of service speak to the importance of his research in this field.

For his major contributions as the parliamentarian, Division 19 leadership, international leadership in hardiness, and improvement of the effectiveness of our Society and military members, I, Stephen V.
