Wyatt Evans, PhD

For his leadership, mentorship, scholarship, and advancement of diversity for the Society and military community through research of diverse subpopulations of the military, and for his work in building collaborations among the Divisions.

Dr. Evans joined the Society in 2011, and has held multiple leadership and mentorship roles during this time. He is currently the chair of the Diversity in the Military Committee, and in this role he has initiated efforts to spread awareness of the diverse roles our members fill in the military community, as well as focusing on research on diverse subgroups of service members. This year, Dr. Evans organized his committee and military subject matter experts to reaffirm our commitment and support of transgender individuals serving in the military. Dr. Evans has worked to build relationships and collaborations in the arena of diversity in the military as demonstrated in the APA convention conversation hour representing Division 19 with Division 44. In addition to his role as Chair of the Diversity in the Military Committee, Dr. Evans has also served as a critical member of the Regional Symposium Series Committee, and as a Capstone Mentor for the Society Leadership Program membership project. The Society recognized Dr. Evans for his achievements and contributions in 2018 with a Professional Development Grant.

Dr. Evans is currently serving as a Staff Psychologist for the North Texas VA, a Clinical Psychologist for the Psychology Care Associates in Southlake, TX, and an Adjunct Professor at the University of North Texas and Central Texas College. He has been a Research Associate for the National Center for PTSD since 2016, and served as a Postdoctoral Fellow for the South Texas Research Organizational Network Guiding Studies on Trauma and Resilience (STRONG STAR) Consortium from 2017 to 2019. He has numerous publications, book chapters, and professional presentations centered on treating trauma in service member and veteran populations. His dedication to the field is reflected not only in his work and professional affiliations, but also in his service in various editorial and reviewer positions.
