Major Ryan Landoll, PhD

For his leadership, mentorship, dedication, and innovation in the expansion of the Early Career Psychologist (ECP) Committee and service as the APA Convention Program Chair of Division 19.

Maj Landoll is the Assistant Dean for Preclinical Sciences in the Office for Student Affairs at the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences. In Division 19, he has been a champion to increase membership and diversity in the Society, a forward thinker in the strategic planning committee, and a Society Leadership Program mentor. In 2019, he finished his three-year term as Chair-Elect, Chair, and Past-Chair of the ECP Committee of Division 19. In 2019, he also served as the APA Convention Program Chair. In 2020, he will serve as Treasurer for the Division. Maj Landoll has demonstrated tireless effort toward expanding the role of the ECP committee within Division 19, and his efforts to improve the services provided for ECP members of the Division. He expanded the size of the ECP committee to increase visibility of ECP members within the Division as well as provide engagement opportunities for ECP members to become involved in Division 19. He also created professional development grants and oversaw the awarding of four grants in the 2018 cycle. These research grants stimulated a host of research and professional development activities, and all recipients have since progressed to serve on Division 19 committees, or actively engaged in Division 19 initiatives. Because of these efforts, the Society currently has approximately 209 ECPs.

Additionally, Maj Landoll worked selflessly with the Student Affairs Committee to develop a series of informative webinars to assist transition from student to ECP, as well as retention of student members as they graduate and become ECPs in the field.

Lastly, as the APA Convention Program Chair in Chicago, Maj Landoll coordinated a tremendous program that offered presentations on aerospace and operational psychology, ethics in operational psychology, incarcerated veterans, PTSD, sexual assault, suicide, women in the military, and a variety of other CE producing events. For the first time in the Division, a “wine down” rapid submission poster session was offered at the prompting of Maj Landoll. Over 80 posters were displayed over the course of the convention in Chicago.

For Maj Landoll’s leadership, mentorship, and unwavering commitment to the betterment the ECPs and his dedication and innovative work on the convention, I, Stephen V. Bowles, take great pleasure in presenting this Society for Military Psychology Presidential Citation to Maj Ryan Landoll.
