#### UNIFORMED ARMY PSYCHOLOGY NEWS

Congratulations are in order for LTC Cecil Harris, OTSG Psychology Consultant who was promoted to Colonel on 1 July. Also to be congratulated are the following Captains who were recently selected for promotion to Major: Johnston Beach, Barry Blum, Franklin Brooks, Nathan Bender, James Chestnut, Robert Gifford, Gary Greenfield, Dennis Grill, Harold Rosenheim, James Siebold, and Thomas Waddell.

The call for papers for the 1980 Biennial AMEDD Psychology Symposium went out on 4 June, the point of contact is CPT Klusman at WRAMC (AV 291-1065). The deadline for papers is 15 September and the conference will be at WRAMC from 27-31 October.

The Child Psychology Fellowship will begin this fall at MAMC. The Fellow has been selected and the name will be released by OTSG later this month. The other two Fellowship proposals are still at OTSG pending approval, the OTSG Policy Council will act on the proposals on 8 July.

AMEDD Psychology is now between 25 and 30% short of authorized personnel. The Health Professional Scholarship Program has 40 Army Psychology students enrolled and 26 others have been selected pending approval for entry in the program. All slots are now committed and COL Harris would like to thank all who were involved. Approximately 15 of the students served 45 days active duty this summer at one of the four AMEDD Psychology internship sites or the counseling center at the USMC (West Point).

All but one of the internship slots for the academic year 1980-81 have been filled. Four interns will go to WRAMC, four to WBAMC, four to the MEDDAC at Ft. Ord (Silas B. Hays Army Hospital), and three to DDEAMC. Of the 15 interns, 9 are HPSP students, six are from civilian programs, and three have had prior service.

#### IN MEMORIAM

Division 19 mourns the death of one of its most distinguished members, Dr Earl Jones. Dr Jones was a fellow of the APA and past president of the Division of Military Psychology.

Dr Jones retired in June of 1979 after a federal career of 32 years. He spent four years in the Navy, from 1942-1945, as an ASW Officer, Navigator, and Executive Officer. In 1951 and 1952 he worked for the US Air Force, Lackland Air Force Base, doing research on transfer of training and retention of complex skills. In 1952 he transferred to what was then the Navy Personnel Field Activity where he became one of the main forces behind its development into the Navy Personnel Research and Development Center (NPRDC). He served as Director of the Training Research Department from 1953 to 1962, and Director of the Navy Training Research Laboratory from 1962 to 1973. Thereafter, until his retirement, he served as Director of Independent Research and Development and Head of Advanced Planning at NPRDC.

Dr Jones obtained his doctorate in experimental psychology in 1951 from the University of Washington. From 1976 to 1979 he was a member of the Navy Laboratories Corporate Planning Group. In 1970, he served as consultant for ARA in Vietnam on Vietnamization Training; the same year he served as a NATO lecturer on Instructional Technology.

In addition to the APA, he was a Fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science and a member of the American Educational Research Association, Human Factors Society, and Psychonomic Society.
