NEWS ABOUT MEMBERS

Anne Hoiberg was awarded the Major Louis Livingston Seaman Prize, presented at the 89th Annual Meeting of the Association of Military Surgeons of the United States on October 18, 1982. The award was for the most notable paper published in Military Medicine during 1981: "Cancer among Naval Personnel: Occupational Comparisons."

Jo Hunter's new book, Families Under the Flag: A Review of Military Family Literature, has been published by Prager Publishers, New York, NY.

Dennis Patrick Wood has co-authored a book, A Clinical Hypnosis Primer, with George Pratt and Brian Alman. It is scheduled for publication by the PCA Press, La Jolla, CA in August 1983.

Anne Hoiberg is the editor of a book, <u>Women and the World of Work</u>, published in 1982 by Plenum Publishing Corporation. The book is a compilation of papers presented at a NATO-sponsored sysposium held in Lisbon, Portugal, August 4-8, 1980, directed by the author.
