My Background: I am a board certified, USAF Lt Col, Clinical Health Psychologist (CHP). I have held the following positions: Psychology Intern, Chief of substance abuse and mental health clinics, base Director of Psychological Health, Flight Commander, CHP Fellow, and Psychology Internship Training Director. I am currently a Senior Research Psychologist at the 711th Human Performance Wing (Dayton, Ohio) where I conduct occupational health assessments and consultation for Commanders, and research embedded and population health-based interventions. I have served overseas, deployed, and traveled to train partner nations' militaries. I have served on the board of the Society of Air Force Psychologists, the Texas Chapter for the Association of Contextual Behavioral Sciences (ACBS), and I both founded and served as the first president of the ACBS ACT for Military Special Interest Group. I am also a member of the Motivational Interviewing Network of Trainers, I volunteer as an examiner for the Clinical Psychology ABPP, and I am pursuing International Coaching Federation certification.
